Azerbaijan: Trans-Caucasian Rail Link Project

In October 1999 the EBRD agreed a loan in the amount of USD 20.2 million. The loan enabled Azerbaijan State Railways to rehabilitate and modernise parts of the trans-Caucasian railway line and to improve the efficiency and environmental performance of its oil tanker wagon washing facilities. This will facilitate the increasing traffic moving between Central Asia and the Georgian Black Sea Ports. The project also supported a number of commercial initiatives to assist in the transition of Azerbaijan State Railways to market conditions.

This project was classified B/1 requiring an Environmental Analysis of the overall environmental impacts of the operation and an environmental audit carried out on the Balajari Wagon Washing Plant. The audit, which was undertaken by international environmental consultants, revealed the existence of serious environmental problems associated with the past and present operations of the plant, which has been in existence since 1937. As a result of the audit, it was agreed to include the rehabilitation and modernisation of the Balajari plant as part of the overall investment thus ensuring the attainment of significant environmental benefits. A condition of the Bank's involvement in the financing of the investments also included a requirement for the Azerbaijan Railways to develop an in-house capacity for environmental management and to implement a specific Environmental Management Plan for the Balajari Wagon Washing Plant, the most environmentally significant component of the project. The Environmental Management Plan outlined a number of specific actions to reach regulatory compliance in the areas of air emissions, waste management, materials handling and storage, as well as energy conservation, waste reduction, occupational health and safety and emergency response. The results of these actions can be seen in the positive changes to the Washing Station shown in the photographs below.

ADDY: Locomotive

Since 1999 rail traffic has continued to increase with freight traffic in 2005 expected to be nearly 25 million tonnes As a consequence of the increased demand, and with little investment in its locomotive fleet since 1990, ADDY is encountering problems in ensuring the transport demand can be met. It has therefore approached the EBRD to finance the purchase of new electric locomotives and track machinery, the refurbishment of linehaul and shunting locomotives and the provision of equipment to a number of locomotive depots where repair works are undertaken. The EBRD loan to ADDY will finance: (a) the purchase of new electric locomotives and track

maintenance machinery and overhaul of 19 diesel shunting locomotives; (b) the overhaul of 10 electric linehaul locomotives; (c) the overhaul of four linehaul diesel locomotives; (d) workshop equipment; and (e) track machinery comprising a ballast cleaner and tamping equipment.

The environmental investigations, which included a site visit by EBRD's Environmental Specialist, confirmed that there are **no** significant direct environmental issues associated with the project. Such effects as there are will be positive, as the improved efficiency of the new and overhauled locomotives will be less noisy and consume less energy, both electricity and diesel fuel. The Project is also likely to increase safety and efficiency of ADDY's railway operations and to reduce risk of oil spills particularly as the transport of oil and oil products constitutes about 75 percent of Azeri freight traffic. The proposed project will assist ADDY in meeting the increasing demand for oil and oil products traffic primarily along the east-west trans-Caucasian railway line.

Description of the activities of the organization:

1. Conducts educative works among oil workers;

- Implemented educative program on study of Azerbaijan Labor Code among oil workers due to funds of Great Britain Westminster Fund, America Eastern Europe Institute, the Netherlands Embassy, Royal Norwegian Embassy to Azerbaijan in 1999, 2000 and 2002;
- Renders free legal aids to oil workers, implements monitoring of judicial processes, makes disclosures to the domestic and international community on the offences made by judges during the trial and corruption cases happened. In 2006 as a result of legal aid and court protection of the Organization defence of 15 local employees was organized, suits

- of 13 of them were met. In 2005 3 suits that were not met in Azerbaijan courts were taken into execution of European Human Rights Court. These suits include complaints against BP Azerbaijan company, BOSS SHELF Company, contractor in PHASE-1,2,3 on full scale exploitation of ACG fields and SOCAR.
- Renders legal aids to local employees working in contractor and subcontractor companies involved in oil projects implemented in oil sector of Azerbaijan in field of creation trade unions. Just as a result of this in 5 foreign companies participating in oil projects local employees created their trade unions.

2. Implements public control on projects funded by IFI, holds monitoring:

- Organization held monitoring in 2003, 2004 and 2005 on impact of BTC oil pipeline on socio-economic problems in districts of Azerbaijan (financial support by Open Society Institute Assistance Foundation and Global Greengrants Fund), attended the audit of the results of the monitoring held on impact of BTC oil line on environment (2005-2006), held BTC monitoring in territories of Turkey and Georgia in frame of international missions.
- o Organization is currently involved in monitoring of ADB's financed Urban Water Supply and Sanitation Project (financial support by Global Greengrants Fund).

3. Takes active part in fight against corruption in the country:
