

TERRITORIAL JUST TRANSITION PLAN CHECKLIST

In order to be successful, each section of a territorial just transition plan must:

OUTLINE OF THE EXPECTED TRANSITION PROCESS

- ✓ A yearly estimate of the GHG emissions reduced through the implementation of the Plan.
- ✓ Direct references to the NECP and clear explanations of the contributions of the TJTP.
- ✓ Consistency with climate neutrality should take precedence over consistency with the NECP.
- ✓ Yearly estimate of installed capacity in the region by type and of tonnes of coal mined.



IDENTIFY THE TERRITORIES EXPECTED TO BE THE MOST NEGATIVELY AFFECTED

- ✓ Mention of current and estimated future jobs in high-carbon industries in the region.



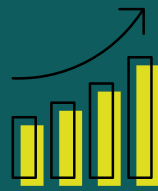
ASSESS THE ECONOMIC, SOCIAL AND TERRITORIAL IMPACT OF THE TRANSITION

- ✓ Evaluation of the potential of all sectors of the economy, not just those typically identified for just transition support.



IDENTIFY DEVELOPMENT NEEDS AND OBJECTIVES BY 2030 TO REACH CLIMATE NEUTRALITY

- ✓ Assessment of existing social issues in the region.



BE CONSISTENT WITH OTHER NATIONAL, REGIONAL OR TERRITORIAL STRATEGIES AND PLANS

- ✓ Evaluation of the contribution to NDCs and to Paris Agreement goals.



STATE TYPES OF OPERATIONS ENVISAGED

- ✓ Clear mention of operations which cannot be financed.



- ✓ SELECT PROGRAMME-SPECIFIC OUTPUT OR RESULT INDICATORS



SUPPORT PARTNERSHIP

- ✓ Concrete participation provisions and timeline for the participation procedure.



MONITOR AND EVALUATE

- ✓ Defined qualitative indicators, not only quantitative ones.



HAVE COORDINATION AND MONITORING BODY/BODIES

- ✓ System of checks and balances to ensure fair decision making.
