- completed in 2006

Project aims

- restore the company's productive capacity
- improve the efficiency of its steel mills and coal mines
- mitigate the environmental and health and safety impacts

Transition impact

“The project has a high demonstration effect as the first turn-around and privatization of a large fully integrated former monopoly in Kazakhstan. It introduces environmental awareness in the region, stabilises employment and encourages the establishment of small and medium-sized enterprises.

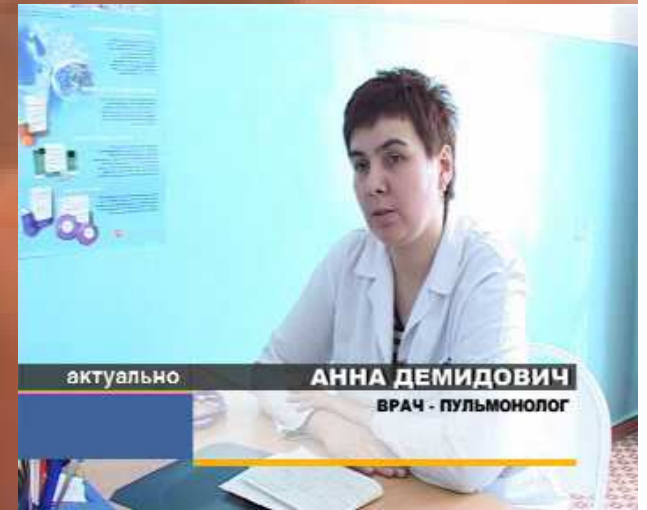


