Dear Mr. Thunell:

The undersigned coalition of development, environment, human rights, professional, faith-based, gender, youth and economic justice organizations are writing to express our interest in the International Financial Corporation's (IFC's) three-year review of its Policy on Disclosure of Information, and its Policy and Performance Standards on Social and Environmental Sustainability Policy.

Because the Policies and Performance Standards on Environmental and Social Sustainability were such a departure from previous IFC policies, the Board, when it voted to approve them in 2006, required that the IFC conduct a three-year review to determine their effectiveness. Specifically, one of the aims of the review, as stated by the IFC, is to assess the "impacts on the natural environment and the communities affected by IFC projects."¹

In order to meet these objectives, it is essential that IFC solicit input from individuals and communities who have firsthand knowledge of project impacts and effectiveness, including intended beneficiaries, indigenous peoples and their representative federations and civil society partners, those subjected to displacement and those who have experienced changes in their local environments. This input will contribute to a balanced and grounded assessment of the effectiveness of the policies and Performance Standards and, ultimately, policy revisions that facilitate positive development outcomes.

We understand from IFC staff that management will propose a plan to the Board to undertake external consultations regarding implementation of the Policies and Performance Standards and seek suggestions for any revisions. However, we are concerned that the proposed review process does not guarantee an opportunity for robust public consultation. In particular, we are concerned that IFC has not made a commitment to ensure that those most affected by IFC-supported projects are provided with the space to share their experiences and influence policy revisions.

We expect that the current assessments by the Office of the Compliance Advisor Ombudsman will provide meaningful feedback on the effectiveness of the Policies and Performance Standards from the perspective of the affected communities. However, this does not discharge IFC's responsibility to consult with communities in conducting its

own review. In this regard and drawing from the perspective of civil society, we would like to make a set of recommendations to further strengthen the review process:

- Commit to transparency of the review process by publishing the review timeline, external comments received during and throughout the process, and relevant internal and external assessment reports, including the list of projects evaluated as part of the review;
- Designate a contact person for the review process; and update the public in a timely manner on the progress of the review.
- Throughout the review, ensure translation of the approach paper and subsequent policy drafts into the languages accessible by those being consulted at least 4 weeks in advance of public consultations.
- Disclose the approach paper in early August 2009 to allow civil society groups to prepare for a public comment period starting in September and subsequent discussion during the Annual Meetings in Istanbul. Consultation on the approach paper should be for a period of at least 8 weeks.
- Develop proposed revisions to the Policies and Performance Standards and indicate whether and how comments received during the consultation period were incorporated into those revisions.
- Organize a series of face-to-face consultations in each region to discuss <u>proposed</u> <u>revisions</u> to the Policies and Performance Standards on Social and Environmental Sustainability and Policy on Disclosure of Information. These consultations should be accessible by project-affected communities and their civil society partner organizations and targeted in project areas that have generated or have the potential to generate adverse social or environmental impacts. Additionally, members of the IFC review committee should attend key consultations in each region or be available to answer questions through a video link.
- Prepare final proposed revisions to the Policy and Performance Standards on Social and Environmental Sustainability and Disclosure Policy and disclose them at the same time that they are circulated to the Board of Directors for approval. The final revisions should include how stakeholder input was incorporated.

We believe that by approaching the policy review in this manner, the IFC will be furthering our common objective of enhancing the effectiveness of its Policy and Performance Standards on Social and Environmental Sustainability and Disclosure Policy and thereby improving development outcomes.

Three years following the approval of a new set of environmental, social and disclosure standards we welcome the IFC's stated commitment to conduct an implementation review. We hope that the recommendations outlined above will help the IFC to design and implement a thorough and participatory review process that includes the perspective

and experiences of a wide array of civil society and those affected by IFC-supported project. We look forward to your response.
