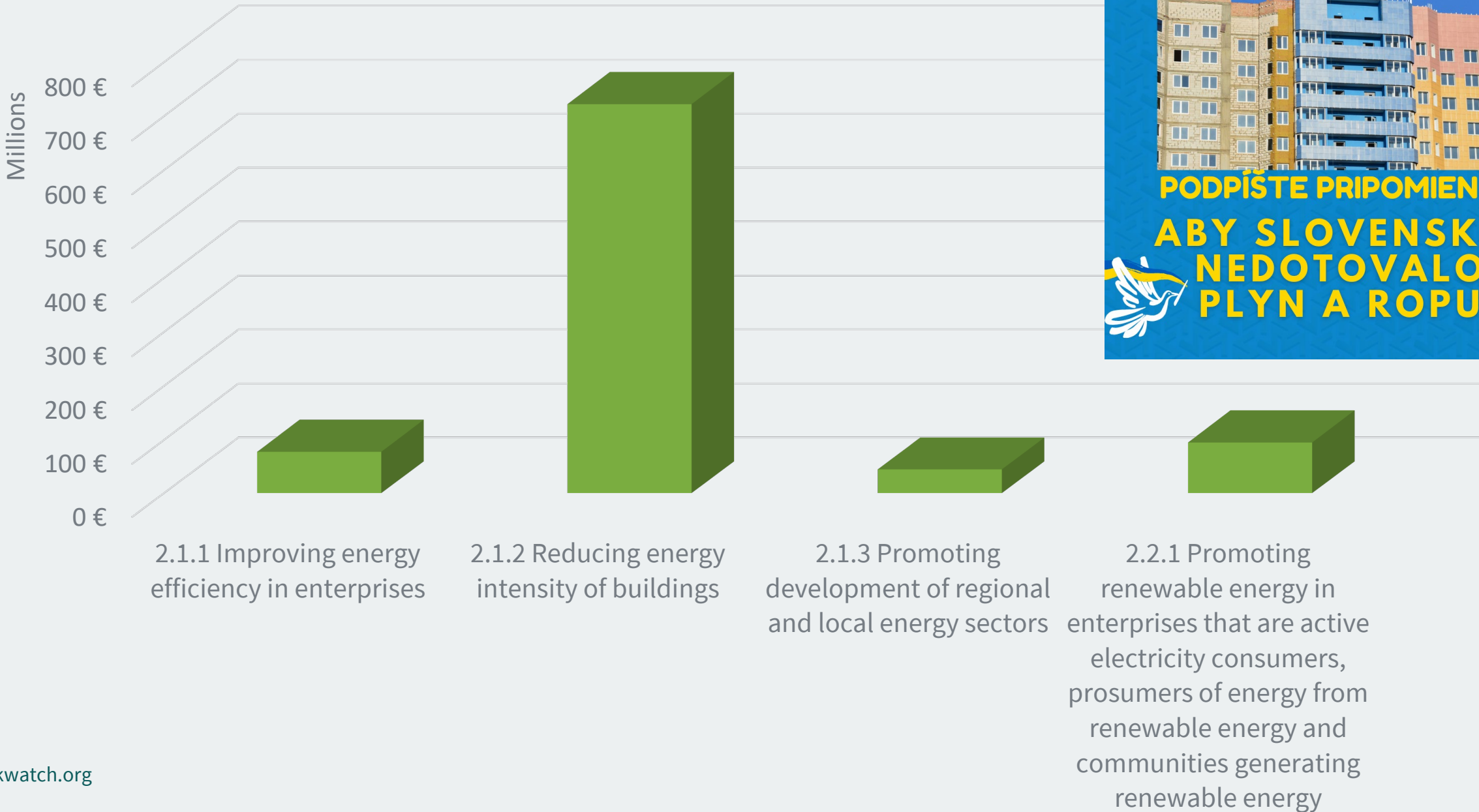

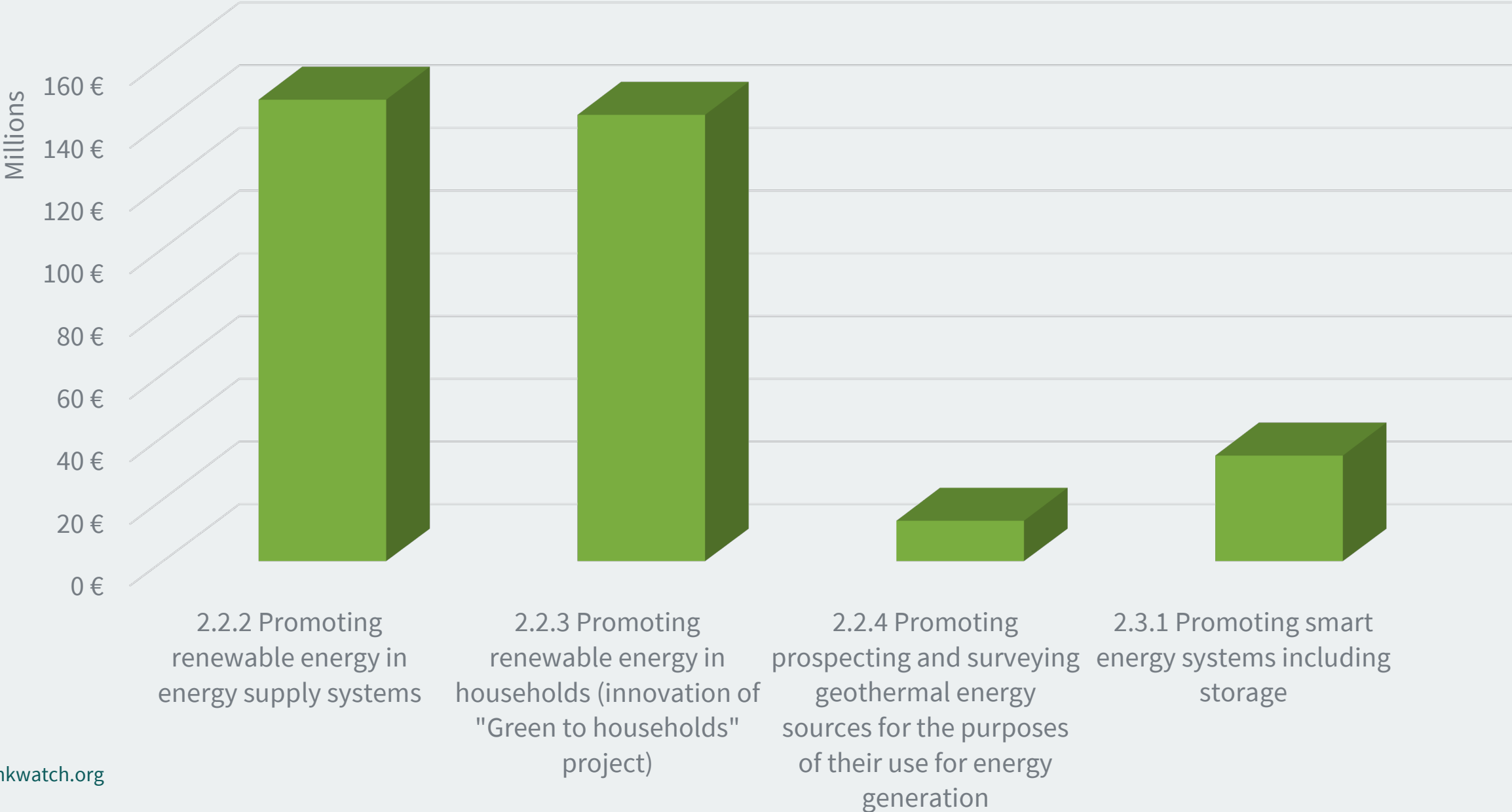

Five points checklist for good partnership

1. Relevant partners are identified early in the planning process;
2. In monitoring committees, partners are able to give expert inputs
3. Partners in monitoring committees receive within 5 working days.
4. Partners are involved early enough
5. The managing authority helps..
(no procedures during school holidays)

Recommendations

1. Embrace yourselves - formalism
2. Proactively nurture interest of experts, NGOs, initiatives
 1. Identify experts
 2. quick expert inputs on ad hoc basis
 3. create informal expert networks
3. Technical assistance – not only for ministries
4. Beware of the „participatory“ smokescreen
5. Decentralisation risks

- Cooperation with municipalities, regional authorities and other progressive stakeholders
- Networking and connecting experts from multiple ministries
- European Community of Practice on Partnership
- National projects – improvements
- Selection and evaluation criteria
- Participatory preparation of calls for proposals
- Specific thematic groups
